Summary Statement

The Federal Communications Commission Office of Inspector General (FCC OIG) is seeking a highly motivated, high-performing Auditor to serve in a reimbursable 6-month detail as Auditor for the Office of Audits. This position is full-time, in person at FCC OIG's office located at 45 L Street, NE, in Washington, DC, near NOMA/Union Station.

To qualify for this position, applicants must have served in an audit, evaluations, or inspection capacity within an Office of Inspector General for at least 3 years, must currently encumber a General Schedule-13-0511 position within the IG community.

FCC OIG is an exciting place to work. In addition to a complex portfolio of audits, evaluations, inspections and reviews our office has a strong history of proactive work aimed at preventing fraud, waste, and abuse. We perform oversight for a diverse set of important programs aimed at promoting connectivity, ensuring national security and more. We are looking for a dynamic candidate to help support our audit, evaluations, inspections, and review enforcement capabilities.

Beyond technical capabilities and expertise, the candidate must possess excellent collaboration, oral and written communication skills, and knowledge of OIG audit, evaluation, and inspection programs, policies, procedures, operations, OIG statutes, and best practices.

Summary of Duties:

In this role, the Auditor will perform one or more of the following activities:

- Conduct comprehensive program performance audits in accordance with GAGAS to assist management with identifying waste, fraud, and abuse in FCC programs.
- Conduct inspections and evaluations of specialized areas in accordance with CIGIE Blue Book to evaluate FCC programs and to assist management in achieving efficiency in methods and procedures for improved control of various program areas.
- Obtain and analyze sufficient relevant evidence to support significant findings, draw objective conclusions and to identify fraud, waste, and abuse in FCC programs.
- Prepare and maintain accurate, well supported working papers and data files, including data from auditees and the OIG data analytics team, and validate and analyze the data to support engagement objectives.
- Prepare written reports and oral briefings for senior leaders concerning significant findings that cover the conditions discovered, their cause and effect, and the resulting recommendations.
- Develop actionable recommendations to FCC Management that they should take to promote compliance, efficiency, effectiveness, and accountability in the administration of programs and operations.
- Support special projects under the direction of senior staff or the Inspector General, involving suspected fraud, misuse of funds, or other matters requiring timely review.
- Perform other duties as assigned.

Highly Recommended Competencies

- Comprehensive knowledge of professional standards and techniques, and understanding laws, precedents, and regulations governing audits.
- Demonstrated skill in oral communications.
- Advanced knowledge of audits, evaluations, and inspections.
- Established record of assisting and coordinating nationwide or agency-specific audit, evaluation, or inspection programs.
- Exceptional skill in written communications.
- Professional certifications such as Certified Public Accountant (CPA), Certified Information System Auditor (CISA), or Certified Internal Auditor (CIA) are highly desirable.
