



Reimbursable Detail Opportunity- Financial or Performance Auditor GS 13/14

The U.S. International Trade Commission Office of Inspector General (USITC OIG) is pleased to offer a reimbursable detail opportunity (four to six months; longer considered) to current Inspector General community staff in Series 0511 at the GS13 or 14 levels. Temporary promotion considered for high-performing GS-12 candidates.

The position is in Washington, DC with telework or remote work. No travel expenses will be authorized.

The opportunity is available starting September 2022 and will remain open until filled.

Detail Description

The detailee will gain exposure to audit work and OIG operations in a small and highly specialized Inspector General office. Work will include financial and performance audit planning on subjects central to the USITC's management challenges and strategic focus areas. The auditor will participate in or lead interviews and briefings of senior managers, collect and analyze data, prepare audit reports and supporting documentation, and complete quality assurance steps. Opportunities to attend senior staff meetings and work directly with the AIG for Audit and other senior staff members within the OIG and Commission. Depending on the start date, the detailee may also participate in the peer review process or information technology reviews.

Mission

The U.S. International Trade Commission is an independent, quasi-judicial Federal agency with broad investigative responsibilities on matters of trade. The agency investigates the effects of dumped and subsidized imports on domestic industries and conducts global safeguard investigations. The Commission also adjudicates cases involving imports that allegedly infringe intellectual property rights.

The Office of Inspector General is responsible for agency oversight, the investigation and prevention of fraud, waste, and abuse, and the promotion of effectiveness, efficiency, and integrity of the USITC.
