Mr. Thomas Caulfield serves as the Executive Director for the Council of the Inspectors General on Integrity and Efficiency (CIGIE) Training Institute. The Training Institute's overall mission is to provide education and training for managers, auditors, evaluators, inspectors, law enforcement officials, attorneys and other professionals in the Federal Office of Inspectors General (OIG) community. Mr. Caulfield has over 37 years of Government service to include the United States Marine Corps, which he retired from in 1997, the United States Air Force, the National Reconnaissance Office, and the Central Intelligence Agency. He is a graduate of Wayland Baptist University and St. Leo College, where he received degrees in both criminology and criminal justice. He holds various certifications some of which include Certified Fraud Examiner (CFE), Certified Inspector General (CIG), Certified Inspector General Investigator (CIGI) and former Certified Polygraph Examiner.

Mr. Caulfield has worked in the oversight, law enforcement and Inspector General community for most of his Government career with his last assignment as the Assistant Inspector General of Investigation, National Reconnaissance Office. He is an Executive Board member of the Association of Inspectors General, a national organization with membership from all levels of City, State, and Federal Office of Inspectors General. He served as a member of the Department of Justice National Procurement Fraud Task-Force and was the architect to what became an amendment to the Federal Acquisition Regulation ("FAR") requiring mandatory disclosure by federal government contractors of certain violations of federal criminal law and the civil False Claims Act. He was the developer and program manager of the first Intelligence Community Procurement Integrity Assurance Program which focused on enhancing the integrity of the organization's procurement processes by preventing, deterring, and detecting procurement fraud.

Mr. Caulfield is a frequent speaker for the National Contract Management Association, the Association of Government Accountants, at the national and local chapter levels, and many other professional contract, audit and investigation associations. He was an instructor with Central Texas College and a former guest instructor for the Inspector General Audit Training Institute, the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center, and the Association of Certified Fraud Examiners. He has held various training committee positions and was the principle designer of several professional development procurement integrity courses at all levels of the Government both domestically and internationally.
