While working as a DUSM, SA Catura participated in several fugitive and outlaw motorcycle gang taskforces, including the FBI Violent Crimes Fugitive Task Force. In addition, SA Catura participated in protection details where he was responsible for the security of Supreme Court Justices and other high-ranking government officials and witnesses in high profile trials around the country.
