Dr. Brett Baker serves as the Assistant Inspector General for Audit (AIGA) at the National Science Foundation Office of Inspector General (OIG). He has previously served as the AIGA at the Department of Commerce OIG, the Director for Internal Review with the Defense Finance and Accounting Service, and the Director for Systems Internal Audit at the Department of Education OIG. Dr. Baker has been recognized by the Council of the Inspectors General on Integrity and Efficiency (CIGIE) with four Awards for Excellence. He has also authored several articles for CIGIE's Journal for Public Inquiry and research community journals on data analytics and grant oversight.
