

**GLADIS C. GRIFFITH**  
**DEPUTY GENERAL COUNSEL, U.S. POSTAL SERVICE, OIG**

Gladis C. Griffith is the Deputy General Counsel for the U.S. Postal Service, Office of Inspector General (USPSOIG). She has provided legal advice to OIG special agents for over twenty years on all aspects of investigations, including interviews, search and seizure, evidence, undercover operations, surveillance, contract fraud, qui tams, whistleblower reprisals, and subpoenas. She assists with criminal, civil, and administrative proceedings, including suspensions and debarments.

At USPSOIG, Ms. Griffith ensures the legal quality of counsel to OIG investigations, provides legal training, runs the OIG ethics program, and counsels on OIG reviews of complex postal programs and operations. The Postal Service processes and delivers over a third of the world's mail and as a leader in the Universal Postal Union establishes best practices, innovation, and rules for the international mailing community.

Other legal experience includes serving as attorney in the Office of Inspectors General for the U.S. Department of State (State/OIG) and the Agency for International Development (USAID/OIG). At State/OIG, Ms. Griffith implemented anti-corruption initiatives with China, Namibia, Vietnam, and Chile to establish independent fraud combating units, similar to the American OIG model. At USAID/OIG Ms. Griffith provided legal advice to investigators combating fraud in high-profile, multi-national and multi-million foreign assistance contracts and grants. Prior to Government Service, Gladis Griffith worked personal injury, contract, and criminal defense cases in Boston, Massachusetts.

Ms. Griffith is also an Instructor for the University of Virginia, where she teaches graduate and undergraduate contracting and management courses. She also taught administrative law, business ethics, and contracts at the University of Maryland, University College.

Ms. Griffith served as the Vice Chair for the Council of Counsels to the Inspectors General and presented before the American Bar Association and the Aspen Institute. Ms. Griffith holds a Juris Doctor degree from Boston College School of Law, and a Bachelor of Arts and Science degree from Boston College and Université Paul Valéry, Montpellier, France. She is member of the Bar of Massachusetts and the U.S. Supreme Court.
