Maryann Lawrence Grodin is General Counsel to the Inspector General at the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission. Prior to assuming this Senior Level Service position, she was a Supervisory Attorney with the Navy Office of the General. She served on active duty and as a reserve officer in the Navy Judge Advocate General's Corps and retired as a Captain in 2010.

Ms. Grodin received a B.A., cum laude, with Departmental Honors in Political Science from Stony Brook University and a J.D. from California Western School of Law in San Diego, California. She is a member of the California Bar and admitted to practice before the U.S. Supreme Court.

In addition to authoring agency publications, her writing has been published in the Federal Bar Journal, the Judge Advocate General Journal, the Federal Ethics Report, as well as the Journal of Public Inquiry, where she served as an Editor. She has served as a faculty instructor and is a frequent public speaker and has appeared at venues including the Office of Government Ethics Conference, the Association of Inspectors General Conference and the American Bar Association Administrative Law Division Meeting.

A current member and the former President of the Rhode Island State Chapter of the Federal Bar Association, Ms. Grodin was also the Chairman of the Council of Counsels to the Inspectors General, from which she was awarded the "Laurence Froehlich Lifetime Achievement Award."
