**Jina Hwang**

Jina Hwang is a Counsel in the Office of Inspector General (OIG) at the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve Board (Board) and the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau (CFPB). The OIG was established by Congress as an independent oversight authority within the Board, the government agency component of the broader Federal Reserve System. In addition, the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act of 2010 established the OIG as the independent oversight authority for the CFPB.

Ms. Hwang advises on labor and employment issues, audits and evaluations, investigations, OIG operations, procurements, and administrative law matters. Prior to this role, she served as an attorney-advisor at the Department of Energy OIG. Ms. Hwang began her ten-year federal OIG career during her third year of law school as a law clerk for the Department of Transportation OIG.

Ms. Hwang has served as an adjunct writing professor at George Mason University School of Law and is a frequent course instructor for the Inspector General Criminal Investigator Academy.

Ms. Hwang is a graduate of the University of Maryland, College Park, with a degree in Political Science. She earned her law degree from the George Mason University School of Law in Arlington, Virginia and is a member of the Maryland State Bar.
