Re: Notice of Need for Extension of 30-Day Review and 150-Day Investigation Periods

Dear Chairmen and Ranking Members:

The Integrity Committee (IC) of the Council of Inspectors General on Integrity and Efficiency (CIGIE), received allegations of wrongdoing pursuant to 5 U.S.C. § 11(d)(4) of the Inspector General Act of 1978 as amended by the IG Empowerment Act. Pursuant to § 11(d)(5)(B), the IC has 30 days to review the allegations to determine whether to initiate an investigation. Pursuant to § 11(d)(5)(B)(ii), this 30-day review period may be extended an additional 30 days if the IC provides written notice to these Committees with a description of why the additional time is needed to evaluate the allegation of wrongdoing.

We are writing to notify you that the IC needs additional time to evaluate complaint numbers: 912, 917, 918, and 919. The IC needs additional time because we have asked for a response from the subjects for each of these matters, and the IC is or will be evaluating the responses to determine next steps.

Pursuant to § 11(d)(7)(C)(i), the IC Chairperson has 150 days to complete an investigation from the date on which the IC made the referral. Pursuant to § 11(d)(7)(C)(ii), if an investigation cannot be completed within the 150-day period, the IC Chairperson shall promptly notify these Committees and brief these Committees every 30 days regarding the status of the investigation and the general reasons for delay until the investigation is complete.

The IC needs additional time to investigate complaint number 890. The status of the investigation is that the OIG assigned to investigate the matter is requesting and reviewing

records concerning the subjects and conducting interviews. The investigating OIG informed the IC that the relevant records are voluminous and required technical solutions to be able to receive and view the data.

We will continue to notify these Committees if there are further delays. We appreciate Congress's patience as we continue to transition the management of the IC from the Federal Bureau of Investigation to CIGIE, including bringing on necessary staff and developing the required infrastructure.
