Robert E. Ray is a Special Agent with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's Office of Inspector General, Office of Investigations. He is assigned to the Inspector General Criminal Investigator Academy as a Program Manager for Advanced and Specialized Training. Prior to his current assignment, Special Agent Ray served in several positions at the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's (DHS) Federal Law Enforcement Training Center (FLETC), including Program Manager for the FLETC's Criminal Investigator Training Program and the Law Enforcement Instructor Training Program.

Special Agent Ray's law enforcement career also includes ten years with the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Office of Inspector General, Office of Investigations. While assigned to the Indianapolis, Indiana field office, Special Agent Ray was as a member of the Indianapolis Safe Streets Gang Task Force and a Special Deputy with the Marion County Sheriff's Department. He also served as a firearms instructor, defensive tactics instructor, and confidential informant coordinator.
