Michael Schexnayder has been a criminal investigator with the Social Security Administration (SSA) Office of Inspector General (OIG) since 1999. In December 2013, he was detailed to the Inspector General Criminal Investigator Academy (IGCIA) where he serves as a Program Manager. He was previously assigned to Houston, Texas as the Resident Agent in Charge. He supervised the Office of Investigations (OI) and Cooperative Disability Investigation Units in Baton Rouge, LA and Houston, TX. Before this, he was assigned to the Jacksonville, FL OI office where he primarily conducted investigations of program fraud throughout Florida and Georgia. He originally was assigned to the SSA OIG office in Cleveland, Ohio where he organized and coordinated an Identity Theft Task Force in northeast Ohio, and worked internal investigations of employee misconduct and program fraud.

Michael began his law enforcement career in 1992 in Cleveland, Ohio, as a special agent with the U.S. Immigration and Naturalization Service, where he worked anti-smuggling cases, investigated immigration benefit and document fraud, and apprehended criminal aliens.

In 2002, Michael was detailed to the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center's (FLETC) Enforcement Operations Division, where he was the lead instructor for Surveillance in the Criminal Investigator Training Program. He was detailed to the IGCIA in 2004, where he served as Program Manager and Acting Director. During this assignment, he developed, implemented and managed multiple training programs for the Inspector General (IG) community. On behalf of SSA OIG and the IG community, Michael conducted liaison and networked with FLETC and its partnering law enforcement agencies for the purposes of collaboration, curriculum review and revision, sharing resources, and resolving student issues.

Michael received his Bachelor of Arts degree in history from Winthrop University in Rock Hill, South Carolina, and his Master of Arts in criminal justice from Kent State University, Kent, Ohio.
