Mike is currently the Special Agent in Charge of the Washington Field Office for the Department of Justice, Office of the Inspector General. He is responsible for a cadre of agents and analysts, who investigate bribery, public corruption and grant fraud in Washington D.C, Maryland, Virginia, North Carolina and West Virginia.

Before his current assignment, he was the SAC and ASAC for the Operations Branch in HQ, overseeing field investigations and operations. His field experience was gleaned along the SW border in the San Diego and Los Angeles Field Offices, in addition to one year at the Washington Field office. During his HQ and field assignments, he conducted numerous bribery, corruption and narcotics investigations often utilizing confidential informants or operating in a shallow undercover capacity.

Prior to his employment with the DOJ OIG in 2002, Mike began his federal career in 1985 as a Special Agent in San Diego for the Naval Criminal Investigative Service. During his 17 years with the NCIS, he's investigated a variety of crimes involving the sale of weapons, homicide, narcotics distribution, assault, theft, and sexual related crimes, both domestically and overseas. Mike has also held various management positions as a Supervisory Special Agent, a Resident Agent in Charge, and an Assistant Special Agent in Charge. During his NCIS field and supervisory assignments, he primarily worked in initiative squads or offices, and has managed or participated in countless shallow undercover operations.
