Offices of Inspector General Report Past Accomplishments and Look to the Future

The Council of the Inspectors General on Integrity and Efficiency (CIGIE) today issued the Federal Inspector General (IG) community's annual report, *A Progress Report to the President, Fiscal Year 2010*. The report summarizes the most significant activities and accomplishments of the IG community during the last fiscal year. In addition, the report highlights CIGIE's strategic business plan accomplishments during the fiscal year 2010.

In fiscal year 2010, the IG Community identified \$87.2 billion in dollar savings as well as program efficiencies and enhancements from a range of audits, investigations, evaluations, and inspections. The IG community was responsible for successful investigations of individuals and entities who threatened government integrity and the public trust. Cumulatively, these efforts resulted in: \$80.2 billion in potential savings from audit recommendations; \$7.0 billion in potential savings from investigative recoveries and receivables; over 5,600 indictments and criminal informations; nearly 5,600 successful prosecutions; over 5,100 suspensions or debarments; and over 440,000 hotline complaints processed.

A Progress Report to the President, Fiscal Year 2010 discusses the IG community's activities from multiple perspectives. The report looks back and highlights key accomplishments of Federal Offices of Inspector General during fiscal year 2010 as they worked to ensure the economy, efficiency, effectiveness, and integrity of government programs and prevent fraud, waste, abuse, and mismanagement.

CIGIE was created by the IG Reform Act of 2008 to address integrity, economy, and effectiveness issues that transcend individual agencies; and increase the professionalism and effectiveness of personnel by developing policies, standards, and approaches to aid in the establishment of a well-trained and highly skilled workforce.
